Strategic Direction

'Equity and Excellence' has been used as a lens to support our school planning for 2024. We have taken time to reflect upon student educational achievement, wellbeing and engagement, and culture and inclusion as we set our school priorities for this year.

The 2024 Annual Improvement Plan is now being enacted with a focus on our four areas:

- Students: Engagement and wellbeing
- · Staff: Curriculum and collaboration
- · Learning: High impact pedagogy

We continually plan, reflect, review and adjust specific strategies related to Australian Curriculum V9 familiarisation and implementation, the effective teaching of reading, student engagement and support and reviewing our whole school approach to pedagogy.

2024 Queensland Engagement and Wellbeing Survey: Year 4, 5 & 6 students

Early next term, Year 4, 5 & 6 students will be asked to take part in the Queensland Engagement and Wellbeing (QEW) Survey. We know that wellbeing and engagement are important parts of your child's life at school. The department and our school are looking at ways to collect information on these important areas so we can support our students in the best way possible. The QEW Survey is designed to measure how students view their wellbeing and engagement.

In 2024, the QEW Survey will take place between these dates: **Tuesday 16 April to Friday 10 May, 2024.**

2025 Prep Intake

Prep 2025 enrolment intake will open from 01 February 2024. As per the Enrolment Management Plan, only students whose principal place of residence is within the school's catchment area will be eligible for enrolment at the school. Students who are siblings of current* students at the school are also deemed eligible for enrolment. We are therefore requesting that younger siblings of students that will be current in 2024 who are eligible for prep in 2025 complete the enrolment forms and lodge with the office from 01 February 2024. A reminder of the age rules for prep 2024: If you have a child born from 1 July 2019 – 30 June 2020 he/she is eligible for prep enrolment in 2025 at Frenchville State School. Please complete an enrolment form and return it to Frenchville State School.

Students residing out of catchment are welcome to make application for enrolment and will be placed on a waiting list.

2024 National Assessment Program: Civics and Citizenship – Main Study

In 2024, a sample of Year 6 and Year 10 students from across Australia will take part in an assessment in civics and citizenship.

The NAP – Civics and Citizenship (NAP–CC) sample assessment is a national assessment for Year 6 and Year 10 students in civics and citizenship education. Students' knowledge and understanding, as well as attitudes, beliefs, and behaviours, related to civics and citizenship are assessed. The assessment monitors and reports on the overall progress being made towards achieving high standards of civics and citizenship knowledge and understanding in Australia.

Results from the assessment are used to:

- inform schools, education ministers and the community about levels of achievement in civics and citizenship education among Year 6 and Year 10 students across Australia, with the goal of supporting students to become active and informed citizens
- support improvement to teaching and learning programs.

A random sample of 20 x Year 6 students at Frenchville State School will participate in the Civics and Citizenship test on Tuesday 21 May at 9:00am.

If your child is selected for the assessment, they will be taking part in a world-class online assessment designed by education experts, giving your child an excellent learning opportunity. The tests are designed in an engaging way to bring out the best in students. Your child is not expected to study for this assessment and no preparation is necessary. There are separate tests for Year 6 and Year 10 students.

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Learning is **PAW-fect** with an educational support dog!

Frenchville State School is very fortunate to have K9 Maggie. She is not your normal pet dog. Maggie is a working K9 Assistance Australia dog who is dual trained as my personal assistance dog and as an educational support dog. Maggie and I have completed the K9AA's training program and continue with maintenance training and complete an annual Public Access Test. K9AA's aim for animal assisted therapy is to improve the physical, mental and social well-being for the whole Frenchville school community. When interacting with students, Maggie's main role is to be an educational support dog. Maggie's superpowers include bringing a calm, relaxed presence and joy into our lives, every day! Researchers led by *Rahel Marti, at the University of Basel in Switzerland, report that viewing (yes, by just looking at Maggie) and touching dogs, it engages the social brain, according to neuroimaging.

Other benefits of having Maggie in our school include:

- ✓ Providing unconditional love to all.
- ✓ Being a non-judgemental friend.
- ✓ Teaching students how to be empathetic. Students learn to care about someone other than themselves.
- ✓ Reinforcing positive relationships. She will be a bridgemaking connections between students and teachers.
- ✓ Recognising signs of anxiety/stress and she is trained to use her disability mitigating tasks.
- ✓ Provide a safe and nurturing environment.
- ✓ Helping students increase their self-confidence.
- ✓ Encouraging students to stay in the classroom and engage in their learning.
- ✓ Reducing anxiety of students when completing tasks like reading and writing.
- ✓ Providing reassurance when students are taking academic risks and stepping outside their learning comfort zones.
- ✓ Reducing incidences of antisocial behaviour and bullying.
- ✓ Supporting and promoting engagement: Internalize selfregulation.
- ✓ Reducing the frequency and intensity of aggressive outbursts. Hence, increasing learning engagement and the length of on-task behaviour when faced with distractions.
- ✓ Facilitating personal coping skills and strategies. To help students to manage frustration and seek emotional support that will help to develop internal controls and coping skills.
- ✓ Assisting students when learning and help them to monitor changes in their own behaviour. She will be a scaffold to support learning and improve student progress.

There is a wealth of research to prove how and why this happens using a lot of scientific jargon. The main thing is, over the last two years, I've witnessed these benefits first hand, day after day. It's the small things that Maggie does that makes the biggest difference in improving the social, emotional well-being of all those around her.

We are looking forward to sharing the joy of Maggie and helping students to calm down and concentrate better so they can make the most of their wonderful learning opportunities at Frenchville.




